## FEDERAL CONSISTENCY REVIEW NOTICE

The Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone Management (CZM) Office is reviewing the proposals listed below for consistency with its enforceable program policies. The Metropolitan District Commission of Boston is proposing to restore Wollaston Beach located in Quincy, MA. Contact Rebecca Haney.

The Algonquin Gas Transmission Pipeline Project NPDES permit is a new permit for the one-time discharge of treated water at two locations, Weymouth Fore River (1.5 million gallons) and Massachusetts Bay near Deer Island (3.7 million gallons). Floodwater will be pumped into 29.4 miles of 30-inch pipe in order to help with its burial and to test the pipe for leaks. The floodwater will contain a biocide to prevent corrosion of the pipes. The biocide in the floodwater will be neutralized with hydrogen peroxide before discharge. The permit includes a monitoring plan to ensure neutralization before discharge. Contact Todd Callaghan.

The Central Artery/Third Harbor Tunnel NPDES permit is a renewal of an existing permit. This permit is for the construction dewatering stormwater discharges associated with the construction of the roadway and the tunnel. The discharges occur at 33 different points into the Charles River, Boston Harbor, Fort Pt. Channel, and the Millers River. Currently, excavation for the project is over 90% complete.
